1916, June 28 – Enlisted into the 113th Overseas Bat. CEF* in Calgary, Alberta, Canada
1916, Sept 26 - Embarked Halifax S.S. Tuscania
1916, Oct 06 – Arrived England
1916, Oct 09 – 113th Bat. – Transferred to 17th Reserve Bat. E. Sandling, Kent,UK
1916, Nov 12 – Transferred to the 16th Bat. E. Sandling

[Insert] 1917, April 09–12 Battle of Vimy Ridge; 16th Bat was part of the Canadian contingent

1917, April 09 – Sustained a GSW* Rt Elbow & Forearm at Vimy Ridge - admitted to hospital
1917, April 19 – Admitted to #13 General Hospital, Boulogne, France
1917, April 20 – Admitted to 1st/5th Northern Gen. Hospital in Leicester, UK
1917, April 23 – Invalided – wounded & posted to M.R.D in Shorncliffe, UK
1917, May 18 – Transferred to Canadian Mil. Hospital, Hastings, UK
1917, Sept 12 – Send to a Canadian Hospital in England
1917, Oct 29 – Sent to Kirkdale, Liverpool hospital
1917, Nov 30 – Sent to Canada to convalescent Home
1917, Dec 04 – Edmonton, outpatient – APRIL 1, 1918 – Edmonton, outpatient
1918, Mar 31 – Edmonton - Discharged Reason - Medical - unfit

WWI – 2nd Tour of Duty

1918, May 09 – Voluntary enlistment date to First Depot Battalion, Alberta Reg't – “Bullet wound right arm shrapnel wound right wrist, scar on elbow and neck from operations,”
1918, July 28 – Left Montreal for Overseas
1918, Aug 15 – Arrived in Liverpool, England
1918, Aug 18 – Arrived at Bramshott Camp, England
1918, Oct 18 – Transferred to the 11th Reserve Bat. – Bramshott Camp
1918, Dec 11 – Arrived at Seaford, UK
1919, Feb 12 - Canadian regiment in Eastbourne
1919, Mar 03 – Seaford, UK
1919, April 19 – Transfer to Kinmel Park for return to Canada ... Seaford
1919, May 20 – Discharged Calgary, Alberta – Reason –Demobilization
